
INTRODUCTION

¹⁶ All Scripture is inspired by God and is profitable for teaching, for rebuking, for correcting, for training in righteousness, so that the man of God may be complete, equipped for every good work. (2 Timothy 3:16-17)

We know we should read the Bible, but we forget sometimes. Maybe we take God for granted—the friend who’s always there for us.

Or maybe the day gets away from us, the way days often do. Or perhaps we think we’re ill-equipped to read the Bible. We don’t like to read, think

we need specialized knowledge, or feel bewildered by the Bible. For all those reasons and more, we sometimes find our Bibles wedged into the backseat of a car or sitting on a bookshelf, collecting dust.

But the Bible is alive! The author of Hebrews describes God’s Word as “living and effective” (Hebrews 4:12). That means the Bible is not a dusty, irrelevant tome, but God’s living Word. Through it, He speaks to us today. He tells us who He is, what He is like, and who we are to be as His children.

But we may still hesitate to read the Bible on our own. What if we can’t make heads or tails of a passage? Or what if we arrive at a wrong conclusion? Does that mean we’re “bad” at reading the

Bible? Can’t we just read a psalm or an inspiring verse for the day and call

everything good? Is there a *special* way to read the Bible, and if there is, should we make an effort to learn it?

To answer the last question, there’s no super-special, top-secret way to read the Bible. But we do recommend a particular method at The Austin Stone: REAP. We’ve found it a helpful tool for anyone pursuing Jesus, and it’s one that can last a lifetime. By using it, the Bible can engage our minds, stir our hearts, and motivate our hands.

WHAT IS REAP?

REAP is a method for studying the Bible. It's not the only one, but it is a helpful one. Its four steps—*read, examine, apply, and pray*—ground you in the Bible, God's always steady and altogether reliable Word. By reading it on a regular basis, you get to know the One who made you and loves you.

REAP also introduces you to the people who populate the pages of the Bible as real people. They struggled with incompetent bosses, unjust rulers, and crippling tragedy. Sometimes they followed God, and sometimes they didn't. When you read about the people in the Bible, you recognize them. You start to examine their stories more closely, because the people in them could be your next-door neighbor, a co-worker, a friend, a family member, or you. As you start to see the similarities between your life and theirs, you consider how their stories intersect with yours and how their lives can inform the choices you make today and tomorrow.

When you enter into that contemplation and consideration of the Bible and the people in it, you begin to understand how God's Word is living and active (Hebrews 4:12). The Bible isn't just some collection of random stories; it is God's Word *to you*. God means it to guide and govern your life—and that's a blessing. We don't always know what to do, but God does. We can turn to His Word, secure in

the knowledge that His way is the best way. When we apply it to our lives, we find the life and joy that can only come from Him.

That discovery of life and joy may cause you to praise God and to pray to Him. That's a natural response to spending time with God, because reading the Bible is how you have a conversation with Him. God speaks to you in His Word, and you reply to Him with your prayers and your actions. You become, in words and deeds, a living prayer to God.

Before we continue onward, let's consider the four steps of REAP (*read, examine, apply, and pray*) in a little more detail.

Read | *What does the text say?*

¹⁰⁵ Your word is a lamp for my feet
and a light on my path. (Psalms 119:105)

To read is to *observe* or *comprehend*. When you read to comprehend, you ask questions like “who, what, when, and where?” The goal in reading is to glean facts, not to make interpretations. Too often, though, we rush past (or even skip) observation to get to application. We need to *slow down*. We need to read God’s Word as though it’s a letter from a loved one—because it is. God gave us the Bible, because He loves us. He wants us to know Him, and if we want to know Him, too, we should see what He has written for us. To do that, we need to stop power walking through God’s Word and start strolling through it. The more we slow down, the more we notice, and the more we notice, the more we appreciate, love, and are refreshed by God’s Word.

Examine | *What does the text mean?*

¹¹ The people ... received the word with eagerness and examined the Scriptures daily to see if these things were so.
¹² Consequently, many of them believed, including a number of the prominent Greek women as well as men. (Acts 17:11-12)

Examine gets into the “why” and “how” of the passage. It asks, “Who is the author, and what truth were they trying to communicate to their audience?” This question aims you toward interpretation (what the text meant to the original audience) instead of application (what the text means to you). It also helps you see how people, times, and places connect and relate to one another. Seeing those connections is important, because they guard against taking and applying Scripture out of context. Jeremiah 29:11 is a good example. We often cling to God’s promise of well-being but disregard the rest of the passage. We shouldn’t. Just as we can’t be understood when divorced from our times and places, neither can we fully understand a text when it’s severed from its people, time, and place. Situating Scripture within its context is critical to reaching better interpretations and richer applications.

Apply | *How should the text change me?*

¹⁰ According to God's grace that was given to me, I have laid a foundation as a skilled master builder, and another builds on it. But each one is to be careful how he builds on it. "For no one can lay any other foundation than what has been laid down. That foundation is Jesus Christ. (1 Corinthians 3:10-11)

Application builds upon *reading* and *examining*. It asks, "How should God's Word change *me*?" and "How should God's Word change *us*?" These questions point us toward self-reflection and self-examination. We discover good things about God and probably some bad things about ourselves. When we see those things, we don't carry on as we were; we let God's Word inform and direct our lives. We also share what we've learned about God and ourselves with other people, because the Christian life is a communal life, not a solitary one. We travel together, guarding each other against error and encouraging one another to continue pursuing God.

Pray | *How can I pray the text back to God?*

²⁰ But you, dear friends, as you build yourselves up in your most holy faith, praying in the Holy Spirit, ²¹ keep yourselves in the love of God, waiting expectantly for the mercy of our Lord Jesus Christ for eternal life. (Jude 1:20-21)

When we pray, we often dash off a rote prayer for our friends, family, work, finances, etc. Later, we wonder why God seems distant. We start to worry that we're praying "wrong." The problem, however, isn't necessarily with us. Rather, as Donald Whitney illumines in his book *Praying the Bible*, "... the problem is ... that we say the same old things about the same old things" (20).¹ Whitney offers a solution: pray the Bible. The Bible is a wonderful conversation starter. When it informs our prayers, it provides direction to our prayers. It shapes our attitudes and gives us new words to speak. With the Bible, we'll never have the same old, same old conversation with God again. Instead, we'll have a refreshingly vibrant conversation, one that warms our love for God and inspires us to talk with Him more often.

As you REAP, work through each step in the order it appears, and complete each step before starting the next one. The steps don't operate in isolation; rather, they build upon each other. By reading and examining the text of the Bible before making personal application and praying, **the Bible comes alive for us**. We remember the Bible is God's Word. His voice sounds and resounds through each and every word.

Additionally, by reading and examining a text before applying and praying through it, **we grow in Christlikeness**. Colossians encourages us to let God's Word dwell in us richly (Colossians 3:16). Slowing down to *read, examine, apply, and pray* Scripture is a great way to do that. The Word begins to permeate our beings, creating reservoirs of grace and truth that bubble up, ready to be drawn from. It starts to reshape us so that we look more like Christ, the one who loves us and gave Himself up for us.



M'CHEYNE READING PLAN

Robert Murray M'Cheyne (1813–1844) (pronounced *mek-shayne*) was a Scottish preacher, pastor, writer, and poet. M'Cheyne studied under Dr. Thomas Chalmers at the Divinity Hall of the University of Edinburgh. He was a gifted preacher and a man of deep personal piety, dedicating much of his free time to music, poetry, and study of the Scriptures.

M'Cheyne served as the pastor of St. Peter's Church in Dundee, Scotland, until his early death from a typhus epidemic at the age of 29. M'Cheyne developed a Bible reading plan that is still widely used today. This plan will take the reader through the New Testament and Psalms twice and the Old Testament once in a year.

The first and third readings together cover the entire Old Testament. The second and fourth readings each cover the entire New Testament and Psalms in a year. By reading the first two or the second two selections for each day, you will cover one-half of the Old Testament, the Psalms, and the entire New Testament.
